

CITY WANTS CONEY BEACH.

**Sues for \$30,000, Six Years' Rental
for Sea Gate Sands.**

The city started another action in Brooklyn yesterday to reclaim the beach at Coney Island for the public. Justice Benedict in the Supreme Court, Brooklyn, decided recently that the beach at Steeplechase Park belonged to the city, and yesterday papers were filed in the Kings County Clerk's office by Corporation Counsel Watson in an action against Alrick H. Man, a Manhattan attorney, who owns property at Sea Gate.

The land is on Gravesend Bay, between Sea Gate and West Thirty-seventh Street, Coney Island. The Corporation Counsel contends that this property rightfully belongs to the city, and his action against Mr. Man is for the recovery of \$30,000 damages, representing the rental for six years for the property.

Mr. Man has not filed an answer to the complaint.
