

2 Dangle 90 Minutes On Coney Island Jump

An 11-year-old girl who had found most of the rides in Coney Island's Steeplechase Park "too babyish" talked her father yesterday into taking her up for the 250-foot parachute jump. Halfway down they got stuck and had to wait an hour and a half to be rescued.

Help came from all sides. The Fire Department spread nets beneath them. Several park employes climbed the rigging to free the parachute, which had become entangled in one of the cables.

Two park employes took a half-way ride down to comfort the girl, Carol Anderson, and her 47-year-old father John, a boilermaker of 42-29 195th Street, Flushing, Queens.

Policemen held back 20,000 spectators.

When their parachute was unfouled they were lowered quickly to the ground. The experience had tried Mr. Anderson's nerves sorely.

Carol would admit to nothing of the sort. "I was a little shook up," she said, "but I enjoyed every minute of it."
