

## **GIRL SCOUTS INVADE CONEY FOR PLAYDAY**

Khaki and blue jeans invaded Steeplechase Park at Coney Island yesterday on the twentieth annual Brooklyn Girl Scout "playday."

Arriving by subway, bus, trolley car and truck, 3,900 Scouts deposited their knapsacks in trucks donated by the Brooklyn Gas and Light Company and at 11 A. M. assembled at Surf Avenue and Ocean Parkway for a parade and flag-raising ceremony. Afterward, khaki gave way to blue jeans and huge lunches appeared. By 1 o'clock the lines were formed for amusement rides.

Hidden behind mountains of pink and yellow cotton candy, a group of Brownies stared at the swirling rings of the "Human Pool Table," then abandoned their station to take a rocket trip. Queues promising an hour's wait for the "Steeplechase Horses" and the "Roller Coaster" could not deter senior Girl Scouts.

By 6 P. M., eyes filled with the excitement, the Scouts and

Brownies were headed homeward. Profit for the campaign fund of the Girl Scouts, contributed by the management of the park, was \$1,700.
